## 1 Deliverable Objective

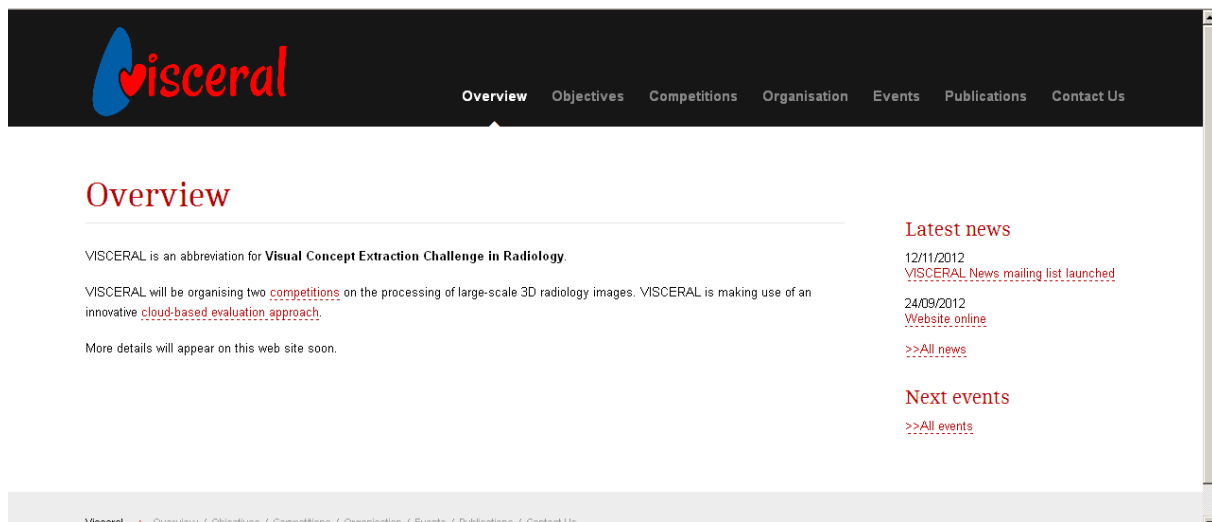


Figure 1: The entry page of the VISCERAL public web site.

This deliverable provides the VISCERAL public website. It is accessible here: <http://visceral.eu>. Figure 1 shows the entry page of the VISCERAL website.

## 2 Architecture

The website is based on the Content Management System (CMS) *Silverstripe*. Members of the project have had positive experience with Silverstripe in the Khresmoi project, and hence the decision was taken to use Silverstripe in VISCERAL.

The CMS itself is written in PHP running on an Apache web server. It is installed on a virtual machine hosted by the IT Service of the HES-SO in Sierre, Switzerland. HES-SO was chosen as host as it can guarantee a post-project existence of the web site for a longer period of time than the TUW.

### 3 Web site content

The TUW is responsible for the content of the web site. Furthermore, one person from each partner has a login for the CMS in order to keep information related to the partner's activities up-to-date.

The entry page contains a short overview of the project, as well as the latest news and events.

The *Objectives* page goes into more detail on the objectives of the VISCERAL project.

The *Competitions* page currently provides a brief overview of the competitions and their timeline. This page will be expanded as the competition definition and organisation advances.

The *Organisation* page summarises how the cloud infrastructure will be used in the competitions. This page will also be updated as the plans for the cloud use advance.

The *Events* page lists the events associated with VISCERAL.

The *Publications* page queries Bibsonomy (a social publication bookmarking site) and provides a list of publications that are tagged in Bibsonomy as being associated with VISCERAL.

The *Contact Us* page gives details on how to subscribe to the VISCERAL News mailing list, which keeps subscribers up-to-date with progress and events in VISCERAL. The contact details of the coordinator are also given on this page.

### 4 Web site objectives

The web site serves as central hub for the dissemination of VISCERAL information. It will host information regarding the competitions, publications, deliverables, and tutorial material. More specifically the objectives of the web site are:

1. To increase visibility of the competitions to members of the relevant research communities, to make the benefits of participation clear, and to bring researchers to contribute already during the process of competition specification.
2. To serve as information hub during the competitions, containing all relevant information regarding schedule, infrastructure, and requirements for participation.
3. To host the competition results, and disseminate them to stake holders beyond the circle of competition participants.
